Thank you for choosing the KindiLink program offered at Narrogin Primary School. We welcome you into the School community and look forward to getting to know you and your child throughout the year.

KindiLink encourages and supports parents and caregivers to be actively involved in activities with their child with a focus on developing children's social, emotional, language and cognitive capabilities.
